Current IABR Board Activities

We meet quarterly. The last meeting was held in-person, in Indianapolis, at the 2024 Breath Summit. There, we had an open meeting with the membership. At that meeting we shared our activities, approved two motions: 1. an update to our bylaws; 2. An increase in membership fee (up € 10 and a change to Euros as a universal basis), and opened the floor to any questions or comments (there were none). In addition, the IABR funded 10 bursaries for attendees of the Breath Summit. Our next ambitions are to review and update our: website, membership process, and to explore scholarships for student exchanges.

2024 Breath Summit, Indianapolis, USA

The 2024 IABR Breath Summit was hosted by Mike Davis in Indianapolis, Indiana, USA from June 2-6th. The Summit was a huge success with over 120 registrants from four continents attending! Over 20 different members of industry and six regulatory agencies sent representatives to attend as well, several of which gave presentations. 59 podium presentations were split between 14 thematic sessions and 60 posters were presented. The IABR and Indiana University (host institution for the Summit) generously provided 10 travel bursaries for early-career attendees. The Journal of Breath Research established an Outstanding Presentation Awards were given to one member of the Rapid Podium Presentation Session each day of the Summit. Those winners were: Antao Gao for, "Assessing response to phage therapy of M. abscessus using breath"; Rashmithara Subawickrama Mallika Widanaara for, "Developing an Electrochemical Sensing Platform for the Detection of Ammonia as a Surrogate for Chronic Kidney Disease Screening"; and Jonas Pangerl for, "From Lab to Lungs: Development of Photoacoustic Systems for Isoprene and Acetone Breath Analysis".

Dr. Waqar Ahmed of the University of Manchester received the Anton Amman Award for outstanding achievements in breath-related research.

2024 Anton Amman Award Medalist Waqar Ahmed Q & A.

How did you get into breath research?

The idea of developing a non-invasive diagnostic method for lung infections initially attracted me to breath research. For most of my PhD, the metabolomics approach to research was the main focus, and I applied these principles to our clinical breath volatile studies. Even today, the invaluable knowledge gained is applied to my study designs, experimental plans, and data processing. I was also fortunate to spend a couple of years in Eindhoven during my PhD, through the Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions programme, providing a chance to immerse in Dutch culture, like speaking English properly and having my bike stolen (twice!).

What excites you most about your research?

Continuing in academic research offered a dynamic environment where no two days are the same. Collaboration with experts across various scientific and clinical disciplines is a constant, along with training the next generation of scientists. Detecting microbial



volatiles in exhaled breath was particularly exciting, and I am keen to explore their underlying mechanisms further. I also enjoy that most of our methodologies and workflows in the analytical lab are driven by clinical studies like RADICA; a fast-track route for people with suspected asthma to be seen by specialist consultants and, at the same time, be part of novel diagnostic research. This is very exciting as the infrastructure is in place; all we need are the validated biomarkers easy!

What does the Anton Amman award mean to you?

I am delighted and honoured to receive the 2024 Anton Amman Award. This recognition not only instills confidence in my abilities as a scientific researcher but also motivates me to continue making meaningful contributions to our research community. When notified of the award, I was able to take a step back and reflect on myself and my research contributions. This is essential for all early career researchers to recognise and celebrate the progress made and the impact, both big and small, on colleagues and the scientific field. Finally, I am truly grateful to my network of mentors, mentees, and peers who have shaped my career, especially to Stephen Fowler and Iain White, whose unwavering support and guidance have been instrumental in my personal and professional growth.
